

Hello Jim,

Despite the current “ban” on evictions in San Francisco, ALRP is fighting a landlord who is seeking to evict a severely disabled client under the health and safety exception to the current court “holiday” on evictions, despite there being no allegations of violence or threats to the health and safety of other tenants in the eviction lawsuit.



The lawsuit alleges that the client is often heard crying throughout the building, a symptom of his disability, but the client has never been violent and has not made any threats to their neighbors or their landlord.


Luckily, an ALRP Housing Attorney filed a motion challenging the lawsuit and the court calendared the argument in June – well after the court holiday has ended.

Please let this victory be a reminder that although some landlords are following the current rules regarding evictions, others are still seeking to evict clients despite the current health emergency the City is facing.
For now this client still has a home!

ALRP remains open and continues to provide essential services to our clients. In times of crisis, it is people like YOU who step up and make a difference.


